ATTRIBUTE	DEFINITION
<i>Class Meeting Attributes</i>	
In Person and Live Streaming	Instructor will assign groups of students to In Person meeting dates to accommodate social distancing.
In Person or Live Streaming	Student may elect to attend In Person or Live Streaming via Zoom.
Internet Online Course	All course content online. No in person class meetings. Learn on your own schedule while meeting instructor deadlines.
Hybrid Course	½ of the course meets has required meeting dates and times and ½ of the course learning is done online. The course syllabus will inform you of the dates and times you will need to participate in a classroom environment.
Supplemental	This class starts later in the semester. Check term dates for last day to drop, withdraw or change to audit at https://www.columbiastate.edu/business-office/refunds-drops-withdrawals.html .
<i>Fees/Cost Attributes</i>	
DEI IncludED	Extra course fee covers reduced rate e-text or instructional materials. No physical textbook required. Financial aid coverage may vary by aid type. Check bill/account to pay uncovered DEI fees prior to payment deadline. Watch for email from bookstore for instructions to access instructional materials or opt-out of purchase.

<i>Curriculum or High Impact Practice Attributes</i>	
1st Year Seminar or Experience 1	Course develops skills to enhance academic and social integration and promote college success.
Certification (1,2,3)	Preparation for Industry / Skill specific certification embedded in course.
Critical Thinking	This course has received permission from the college's Quality Enhancement Plan(QEP) Approval Course Committee to be designated as a critical thinking course. This means that specific assignments are designed to correspond with the college-wide Critical Thinking Rubric. In addition, a pre-test will be administered toward the beginning of the course to assess students' incoming knowledge of critical thinking and how it relates to this discipline and course. Toward the end of the semester, a post-test will be administered to assess students' knowledge of critical thinking and its relation to the course. Students will also be administered an attitudinal survey to share their perceptions of the course's critical thinking implementation.
Honors Education	Course recognized by Honors Program as engaging the intellectual curiosity of advanced students through an experience in interdisciplinary coursework, internal course enrichment, or external engagement with the broader community.
Global Cultural Awareness	Students learn how to communicate across cultures. Course increases student's critical analysis of the global and intercultural nature of society and practice of ethical reasoning to successfully navigate this world.
Learning Communities- Curricula	Students enrolled in two or more courses concurrently.
Service Learning	<p>Course integrates meaningful community service with instruction.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Service Learning 1 – requires service learning component of less than 10 service hours. • Service Learning 2 - requires service learning component of 10 -19 service hours. • Service Learning 3 – requires service learning component of 20 or more service hours.
Study Abroad	<p>Course has a required study abroad component.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Study Abroad 1 – requires trip of less than 7 days abroad. • Study Abroad 2 – requires trip of 7-20 days abroad. • Study Abroad 3 – requires trip of 21 days or more abroad.
Technology Enhanced Learning	Course uses digital technologies to enhance teaching and learning.
Work Based Learning	<p>Course includes practical application or skill development in a professional setting.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work Based Learning 1 requires 30 or less contact hours.

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work Based Learning 2 requires 31-50 contact hours. • Work Based Learning 3 requires 51-100 contact hours • Work Based Learning 4 requires more than 100 contact hours.

LS Read Competency 2	Successful completion of this course meets Reading placement requirements and promotes General Education course success. Must register for ENGL 1010 in the same semester.
LS Write Competency 2	Successful completion of this course meets Writing placement requirements and promotes General Education course success. Must register for ENGL 1010 in the same semester.
LS Math Competency 5	<p>Successful completion of this course meets MATH placement requirements and promotes General Education course success.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Take MATH 0530 with MATH 1530. • Take MATH 0010 with MATH 1010. • Take MATH 0130 with MATH 1130.
